George Family Foundation awards \$1,244,000 in latest grant round

Annual giving tops \$4.7 million in 2018

MINNEAPOLIS (January 24, 2019) – The George Family Foundation announced today it has approved grants that will support equity and social justice programs, youth programs focused on the environment, mindfulness education, and educational efforts to help ensure improved end-of-life choices in Minnesota. The Foundation awarded \$1,244,000 to 40 organizations out of an annual giving budget of \$4.9 million.

In its latest grant round, the Foundation continued its support for integrative health and wellbeing programs, freshwater conservancy in Minnesota and outdoor educational opportunities for urban youth. The George Family Foundation also continued its general operating support of 22 organizations in the greater Twin Cities area.

"In 2018, the George Family Foundation surpassed its annual payout requirement to grantees by nearly \$1.8 million," said Gayle Ober, president of the George Family Foundation. "There is great need in the communities we support, and we are grateful that our trustees are willing to stretch our grants budget so we can all do more."

Other notable grants include \$100,000 to Marnita's Table for general operating purposes, \$50,000 to support the FOODRx program at Second Harvest Heartland and \$25,000 to the Fund for Women's Equality.

Founded by Penny and Bill George in 1994, the <u>George Family Foundation</u> is a \$60 million private family foundation that supports programs which promote integrative health and healing, authentic leadership, spirituality & mindfulness, youth development, the environment, and other select organizations in the communities where George family members live
