The Volunteer desires to work as a volunteer for Habitat and engage in the activities related to being a volunteer. The Volunteer understands that the activities may include but are not limited to the following: loading and unloading materials; traveling to and from worksites; consuming food available or provided; living in housing provided for volunteers; assisting in disaster relief areas; constructing and rehabilitating residential buildings; other construction-related activities; working in the Habitat offices; working during Habitat sponsored events; and over volunteer activities ("Activities").

The Volunteer does hereby freely, voluntarily, and without duress execute this Release under the following terms:

- 1. Release and Waiver. The Volunteer does hereby release and forever discharge and hold harmless Habitat and its successors and assigns from any and all liability, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature, either in law or in equity, which arise or may hereafter arise from the Volunteer's activities with Habitat. The Volunteer understands that this Release discharges Habitat from any liability or claim that the Volunteer may have against Habitat with respect to any bodily injury, personal injury, illness, death, or property damage that may result from the Volunteer's activities with Habitat, whether caused by the negligence of Habitat or its officers, directors, employees, or other volunteers, or otherwise arising. The Volunteer also understands that Habitat does not assume any responsibility for or obligation to provide financial assistance or other assistance, including but not limited to medical, health, or disability insurance in the event of injury or illness.
- 2. <u>Medical Treatment</u>. The Volunteer does hereby release and forever discharge Habitat from any claim whatsoever which arises or may hereafter arise on account of any first aid, treatment, or service rendered in connection with the Volunteer's activities with Habitat.
- 3. <u>Assumption of the Risk</u>. The Volunteer understands that the activities may include work that may be hazardous to the Volunteer, including but not limited to construction and the loading and unloading of supplies and equipment. The Volunteer hereby expressly and specifically assumes the risk of injury or harm in the activities and releases Habitat from all liability for injury, illness, death, or property damage resulting from the activities.
- 4. <u>Insurance</u>. Habitat pays a small health/accident insurance premium on the Volunteer for each day that they work on the construction site. The policy covers only those expenses related to injuries sustained while the Volunteer is working with Habitat that are not covered by the Volunteer's own health insurance. The Volunteer is expected to take all necessary precautions and responsibility for their own safety, and that of

others. The Volunteer is expected and encouraged to obtain their own medical or health insurance coverage.

- 5. <a href="Photographic Release">Photographic Release</a>. The Volunteer does hereby grant and convey unto Habitat all right, title, and interest in any and all photographic images and video or audio recordings made by Habitat during the Volunteer's activities with Habitat, including but not limited to any royalties, proceeds, or other benefits derived from such photographs or recordings.
- 6. <u>Background Certification and Authorization.</u> The Volunteer does certify that they have never been convicted of a crime that requires them to register as a sex offender with any agency. The Volunteer understands some positions require a criminal background check. The Volunteer authorizes Habitat to check their criminal record through any available database or registry. In some cases, this may require an additional background check authorization form.
- 7. Other. The Volunteer expressly agrees that this Release is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the State of North Carolina and that this Release shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina. The Volunteer agrees that in the event that any clause or provision of this Release shall be held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of such clause or provision shall not otherwise affect the remaining provisions of this Release which shall continue to be enforceable.
