Severe **Weather Shelters**



Where would you take shelter at Second Harvest Foodbank during severe weather? You will find this sign in three places.

Our Primary Shelter includes and is concentrated around the

warehouse bathrooms. In addition to the two bathrooms, you can seek shelter in the small office next door and the utility room and small office that back to the bathrooms.

If the Primary Shelter locations fill, we have two Secondary Shelter locations: the break room and the cooler next to the cardboard compactor (just across from the warehouse bathrooms).
